4	Once you try your search, you may find that you need to modify it: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Too many records? Add an additional concept with AND (Example: poverty AND crime) • Too few records? Add another, similar search term with OR (Example: college OR university) • Too many records on an unrelated topic? Eliminate a word with NOT (Example: virus NOT computer) • Use a truncation symbol (*) to search for variants of a word. Right-hand truncation is the most common form of truncation. It allows you to search for the first few letters of a word and retrieve additional letters to the right. Examples: (violen* OR aggress*) AND (child* OR teen*)
