

How to find the full-text and/or use Interlibrary Loan. most of the library's databases provide the full-text articles or book chapters. However, you may find that you retrieve an article or chapter that doesn't have the full-text. It doesn't mean that Randall Library doesn't have it. But it isn't available in the specific database you are searching. If the full-text IS available you'll see a link to the html version of the article or a PDF version of the article. Sometimes both are provided. Html is essentially just text while the PDF is an image of the article. The html version might just be called "full text." The .pdf looks exactly like the article as it was intended by the authors and publisher. If there is a print version of the journal, the PDF looks exactly like it would in the print version. If you look at an article and do not see the html or the .pdf then look for a link that says "Get it from UNCW." This is a tool that will search other databases for the full-text. Once you click the "Get it from UNCW" link a new window will open. You'll often go to a screen that will provide you with a link to the html or pdf or both. If you click on the "Get if from UNCW" and you don't see the full-text, it may be because you are taken to the journal homepage. From here you'll need to search or browse for your article. There are some cases when Randall Library does not subscribe to the journal. That means when you click "Get it from UNCW," you cannot access the full-text immediately. You can however, get a copy of the article through Interlibrary loan. If you have any questions, please use the "get help" section of our library website.
